ELIGIBILITY FOR CLASSES

In the following definitions of classes 1st prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed championship agility, premier agility, open agility or limited agility shows (i.e. special classes and invitational events excepted).

Standard classes may be scheduled for agility shows, as Agility classes or Jumping classes. All standard classes must contain the weaving poles obstacle. Standard Agility classes must contain the following elements: "A Ramp", Dog Walk and See-Saw. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:-

A maximum of 4 standard classes may be scheduled for any dog on an individual day of competition including a maximum of 2 graded classes. Any number of special classes may be scheduled.

Class Structure. A class may either be held as a graded class or a combined class. A graded class may be scheduled for a maximum of 3 consecutive grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A combined class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

A class will be won by the dog that has completed the course in the fastest time with the least number of faults, unless otherwise stated for special classes.

Progression. Progression from each grade will be determined by the eligibility for the class as referenced in H(1)(A)11. Results from combined classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

To count for progression wins must be gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed agility shows.

Only a first place with a clear round completed within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Competitors will be allowed to walk the course set at small, medium, intermediate or large height without their dog(s) before the class begins.

Points Progression. At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to grade 4 by winning 100 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme (Regulation K3.d refers). A minimum of 50 points must be gained in agility (not jumping) classes in the relevant grade. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the show secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

Progression on points must be done prior to the closing date of entries. It is not possible to change a grade on points once the entries have closed.

STANDARD CLASSES

Only 1st prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed agility shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the 2 wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

Grade 1

Open to owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a minimum of two 1st places at Grade 1 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows, at least one of which must have been gained in an agility (not jumping) class. N.B Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1 are not eligible for this class.

Grade 2

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 1 and are not eligible for Grades 3, 4, 5, 6, or 7.

Grade 3

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of two 1st places at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows, one of which must have been gained in an agility (not jumping) class, or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 and are not eligible for Grades 2, 4, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 4

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of three 1st places at Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping classes), or have elected to progress on points from Grade 3 and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 5, 6 or 7

Grade 5

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four 1st places at Grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 4, 6 or 7

Grade 6

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four 1st places at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 4, 5 or 7.

Grade 7

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of five 1st places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows, three of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 4, 5 or 6.

Championship Class (Kennel Club Championship Agility Certificate)

Open to dogs having qualified to compete in Grade 7 which have had 5 wins at Full Height in either Grade 6 or Grade 7, at least 3 of which must be gained in agility classes. To consist of 2 qualifying rounds of standard Kennel Club classes, 1 Agility Class and 1 Jumping Class, and a final round of Agility, to be held at the same show.

SPECIAL CLASSES

Societies may schedule classes other than those defined above as "special classes". The eligibility for "special" classes must be defined by the society and included in the schedule. The word "special" must be included in the title of the class. Where special classes are classified for older and/or inexperienced dogs, the height of the hurdles, the A-ramp, and the dog walk, and the length of the long jump, may be reduced below the dimensions specified in these regulations, in which case such dimensions must be included in the class definition in the show schedule.

Marking for special classes may deviate from marking for standard classes, but must be specified in the schedule. Wins, places and clear rounds in special classes will not count towards agility warrant points or grade progression at Kennel Club shows.

Special Veteran Jumping - for dogs aged 9 years old and over at date of show. This class will contain jumps and tunnels only i.e. no weaves, tyre or long jump.

Large and Intermediate dogs will jump Medium, Medium dogs will jump Small and Small Dogs will jump Micro height. Dogs entered in this class may enter Anysize jumping as well, but cannot be entered in any other classes at this show. Results will be separate, prizes awarded for each height category for Veteran dogs.

Special Anysize Jumping – Open to any size of dog. This class will contain jumps and tunnels only i.e. no weaves, tyre or long jump. Large and Intermediate dogs will jump Medium, Medium dogs will jump Small and Small Dogs will jump Micro height. Dogs entered in this class may enter veteran jumping as well, but cannot be entered in any other classes at this show. Results will be separate, prizes awarded for each height category for Anysize dogs.

Special Junior Agility – Open to handlers aged under 18 on the day of the show. Handlers are not limited to the number of dogs they can enter in this class. Results will be separate, prizes awarded for each height category.

SPECIAL SCOTTISH JUNIOR DOG CLUB 'JUNIOR OF THE YEAR' QUALIFIER 2026

Only open to members of the Scottish Junior Dog Club.

The competition is open to all SJDC members only, aged 6 years and up to, but not including 24th birthday handling any family dog. There are six classes divided by age of member and size of dog as listed below:

Under 12 (Handlers 6 years and up to, but not including 12th birthday)

- Large Dogs
- Intermediate Dogs
- Medium Dogs
- Small Dogs

12 and over (Handlers 12 years and up to, but not including 18th birthday)

- Large Dogs
- Intermediate Dogs
- Medium Dogs
- Small Dogs

18 and over (Handlers 18 years and up to, but not including 24th birthday)

- Large Dogs
- Intermediate Dogs
- Medium Dogs
- Small Dogs

There will be a total of four qualifiers held throughout the year, Kingdom of Fife, Fair City, Gleniffer DTC and Scottish Beardie Club. Each qualifying event entitles the top two placed handlers in the 18-23 category, the top two placed handlers in the 12-17 category and the top two placed handlers in the 11 years and under category to qualify for the 'SJDC Junior of the Year' final.

Classes will also be split into Small/Medium/Intermediate/Large. As this is a special class judges may opt to run it as one class with the results being split as above, this will save time. In the event that a handler has already qualified, the next placed handler will qualify for the final. This process will be repeated until all positions are taken up. Handlers are only permitted to compete with their own dog, or a nominated Dog as per membership rules or a family dog.

Rosettes awarded to third (1st-2nd) place in the 18-23 category, fifth place (1st to 3rd) in 12-12 category and to third place (1st-2nd) in 11 and under category. On behalf of our members, we would like to thank all the Scottish Clubs for supporting us by agreeing to hold these events. Without the support and kindness of such clubs, we would not be able to offer this fantastic opportunity to the Juniors of Scotland.

The Showtime Novice Cup **Regulations 2026**

This is an agility competition for Small, Medium, Intermediate and Large dogs and will be judged under standard Kennel Club rules and regulations. It will be classified as combined or graded 3, 4 and 5. Where the heat is graded the results will be combined for qualification to the finals. Any subsequent grade change will not alter a dog's eligibility to compete in the Final.

There will be 6 heats, the first three from each heat will go forward to the Finals.

The Finals will be split into two parts. The Medium and Large Finals will be held at Dundee Championship Show in August. The Small and Intermediate Finals will be held at Gleniffer Championship Show in September. All finals will take place after the close of show. Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat and may qualify more than one dog for the Final.

Once a dog has qualified for the Final, further heats may be entered for competition, but any placings will not affect the dog's eligibility for the final. The handler that qualifies a dog for the Final will be the handler that competes in the Final.

Heats – All heights will have a trophy for first place and rosettes 1st to 6th.



Scottish Agility Dog of the Year 2026

1. The Scottish Agility Dog of the Year Competition is an annual event organised by The Scottish Kennel Club. Qualifiers compete in a finals of which the winners are awarded the title Scottish Agility Dog of the Year (height category).
2. Qualification for the final will be decided by an accumulation of points at heats. To qualify for points the dog must have been clear in the class; that is having incurred no course or time faults. Points are allocated in each height category as follows:
1st 8 points 2nd 4 points 3rd 2 points 4th 1 point
3. To be eligible to compete the handler must reside in Scotland and the dog's owner be resident in Scotland whenever points are gained. If the dog/handler are not eligible for points (i.e. they are not both resident in Scotland) then the points will move down the places and be allocated to the next Handler / Dog team who are eligible for points. It is possible for the handler or dog to no longer to be resident in Scotland at the time of the final, they will however still receive an invitation to compete.
4. After the final heat the 12 dogs with the most points in each height category will be invited to the finals by the Scottish Kennel Club. In the event of a draw then additional dogs may be invited. A handler may compete in the final with more than one dog.
5. The finals in 2026 will comprise of a single round of agility with competitors running in reverse order according to the number of points they accumulated to qualify.
6. Heats will be held throughout Scotland at Open, Premier or Championship Agility Shows held by KC registered or listed clubs. To host a heat the club applying must have its main operating address based in Scotland.
7. Heats will be held as a standard scheduled agility class, open to all dogs eligible to compete in that class. The class will be held as a combined or graded 6/7 class. This cannot be a capped class.
8. Handlers and dogs will qualify as a team. A dog may, therefore, collect points with more than one handler and these will NOT be amalgamated. A dog may only qualify for the final with one handler, and the handler with the highest number of points will be invited.

Heat Rules

Each heat will take place at six KC Open, Premier or Championship shows held in Scotland. Heats will take the form of a graded or combined 6-7 agility class, held under standard KC rules and regulations. There will be a class at each show holding heats for all four heights of dogs – Large, Intermediate, Medium and Small.

Competitors may enter more than one dog in any heat and may qualify more than one dog in the final. A dog that has already qualified can be entered in further heats.

Qualification and the finals

The first two previously unqualified dogs in each height category from each of the heat will go through to the finals at the Game Fair. Where results in the heat are graded the results will be combined for the purpose of qualification. If a dog that has already qualified is in the first two then the qualification will move down to the highest placed dog.

The winners of last year's CSJ Highland Finals have already pre-qualified for the 2026 finals.

Competitors may qualify more than one dog in the finals. The team (handler and dog) that qualify cannot be changed for either the preliminary round or the final

This year's final will take place at Prestwick Dog Agility Club Show on Saturday 6th June 2026 after show closes. This will consist of a preliminary round and the final. Each will be an agility class judged according to KC rules and regulations.

Rules & Regulations

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed agility shows must be registered at The Royal Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B, or else registration or transfer of registration must have been applied for. The registration number/ authority to compete (ATC) number will be required for each entry.
2. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club authority to compete (ATC) number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club registration number or an authority to compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
3. FEES.
 - Single class entry £5.00 (Fully paid up and working Fair City Members Free of Charge)
 - Pairs Entry - £6.00 non-members; (Fully paid up and working Fair City Members - £1.00 per Pair)
 - There is no charge for NFC entries
 - Facilities Charge £1.90 per day per account holder (Toilets, Waste Disposal and Day Parking) (Fully paid up and working Fair City Members Free of Charge)
 - Camping £20 for the weekend + 2 days facilities Charge (Fully paid up and working Fair City Members Free of Charge)
4. PRIZE MONEY. There will be no prize money at this show.
5. Internet entries only, can be made via www.showtime-online.co.uk
6. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
7. Only dogs of 18 calendar months of age and over on the day of competition are eligible for competition at Kennel Club licensed agility shows.
8. A dog must not compete in the same class more than once, including special classes.
9. Not for competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged 12 weeks and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
10. A bitch which is in season is allowed to attend a show providing it is kept away from the competition areas. Except those dogs that are attending the show to compete in quarter-finals, semi-finals and finals of Royal Kennel Club Prestige Events, other than events held under YKC rules, who are allowed to compete in these classes only. Qualified handlers are asked to remove their dog from the competition area as soon as they have competed in the Prestige Event.
11. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the competition is forbidden.
12. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the show.
13. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A single flat, close fitting collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
14. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
15. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
16. SPONSORSHIP – The Royal Kennel Club, Crufts, CSJ, Showtime-online.
17. Detailed rules for qualifiers are found earlier in the schedule.
18. Kennel Club standard marking regulations apply for all standard classes.
19. Class 50 and 102: Veteran Jumping. Height of the jump obstacles: Large and Intermediate dogs 40cm; Medium dogs 30cm; Small dogs 20cm. Class 51 and 103: Anysize Jumping. Height of the jump obstacles: Large and Intermediate dogs 40cm; Medium dogs 30cm; Small dogs 20cm.
20. The height limit for dogs.
 - a. Large dog classes - For dogs measuring over 500mm at the withers (include only if applicable).
 - b. Intermediate dog classes – For dogs measuring over 430mm and measuring 500mm or under at the withers (include only if applicable).
 - c. Medium dog classes - For dogs measuring over 350mm and measuring 430mm or under at the withers (include only if applicable).
 - d. Small dog classes - For dogs measuring 350mm or under at the withers (include only if applicable).
21. Judges at an agility show may not judge a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the show at which they are judging. Dogs may be disqualified if proved to have been handled in the class by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.
22. Removal of dogs from competition:

Following discussion between the show management and/or a veterinary surgeon, a dog shall be prevented from competing and/or removed from the show if it is:-

 - a. A bitch which is in season (apart from dogs attending the show to compete in quarter finals, semi-finals and finals of Kennel Club Prestige Events, other than events held under YKC rules).
 - b. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
 - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d. Of such temperament or is so much out of control as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.

The circumstances of such a removal shall be recorded in the competition/show Incident Book and submitted to The Kennel Club.
23. Removal of competitors:

No equipment shall be moved without permission of the judge. Any concerns regarding the course shall be discussed with the judge/show management. Any unauthorised movement of equipment may result in removal of the competitor from the show. All such removals should be reported to The Kennel Club in the Incident Book.
24. Dog agility is a competitive and physically strenuous activity. It is the responsibility of the owner/handler to ensure their dog is 'fit for function' and that they themselves are fit to take part. By signing the entry form you confirm that to the best of your knowledge your dog is fit and able to take part in agility classes on the day of the show.
25. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 18 days before the start of the competition, i.e. **(21st April 2026)**, shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary or the show processor at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog should then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees. Failure to notify the show secretary or processor **at least 14 days before the date of the show** will result in the dog being ineligible to compete

at that show.

26. Should circumstances so dictate the society, in consultation with the judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them will be reported to The Royal Kennel Club.
27. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the club/society will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses. If the show processor has the provisions to do so, competitors will be refunded in the manner in which they entered the show, but in any event the society will refund fees within 3 months of the show date to all those who had entered and requested a refund within 1 month of the show date.
28. Except for mobility aids, nothing shall be carried in the hand while the dog is under test and food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog whilst in the ring. Competitors are prohibited from wearing bags or leads whilst under test.
29. No dogs' crates or boxes should be left near or between rings. Societies may, if they wish, designate areas where dogs' crates and boxes may be left in the vicinity of the rings.
30. No smoking or vaping is allowed within the ring area.
31. The handler must set their dog up to start within the ring. Dog and handler must enter the ring together and under no circumstances may a dog be left outside the ring off lead and recalled or sent to the handler in the ring.
32. Should the judge deem a re-run is required, any result and/or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted.
33. Separate entry forms must be completed by each owner and must be signed by the owner or his authorised agent in accordance with provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied by the appropriate fees.
34. Free Passes - Not Applicable.
35. Competition of dogs suffering from contagious or infectious disease – No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the competition may compete. Competitors infringing the regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A11.
36. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Competitors must run as close to their running order as possible. Failure to do so may be reported to The Royal Kennel Club.
37. An exhibitor or competitor should ensure that contact details for any handler are available and must be provided upon request in any investigation of a breach of this regulation by such handler.
38. Animals in Event
No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the Board.
However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
39. A pay on the day class will be held if time permits.
40. A practice ring may be available to dogs entered for competition at the show, if space allows. This ring must be supervised by a responsible adult with agility knowledge.
41. Welfare of Dogs
An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this regulation may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Kennel Club rules and regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any agility show licensed by The Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue and within the precincts of the show.

Directions to Venue

From Edinburgh: Follow M90 to Junction 10. Exit towards Stirling/Crainlarich/Inverness/A9. Continue on M90. At the roundabout (Broxden), take the 2nd exit onto A9. At the next roundabout, take the 2nd exit onto A9. Take the A9294 and take the 2nd exit at both of the next two roundabouts, continuing on the A9294 (New Kingsway). At the roundabout take the 3rd exit onto Stormontfield Road. **DO NOT** turn into the race course. Follow the road for 0.3 miles and turn right. Then continue driving for 0.5 miles where you will have reached the showground.

From Stirling: Follow A9 to Broxden roundabout and take the 1st exit onto A9. At the next roundabout, take the 2nd exit onto A9. Take the A9294 and take the 2nd exit at both of the next two roundabouts, continuing on the A9294 (New Kingsway). At the roundabout take the 3rd exit onto Stormontfield Road. **DO NOT** turn into the race course. Follow the road for 0.3 miles and turn right. Then continue driving for 0.5 miles where you will have reached the showground.

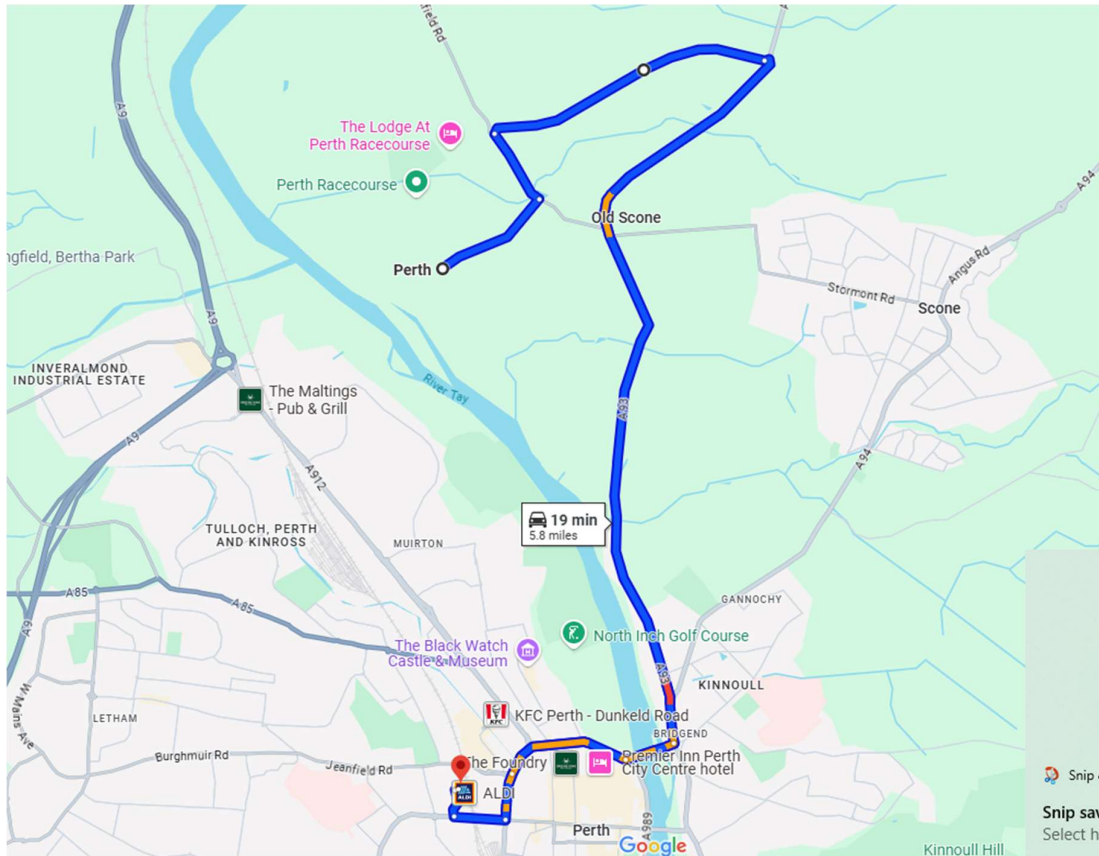
From Inverness: Follow A9 towards Perth and take the exit towards New Kingsway/A9294 which is before the Inveralmond roundabout. At the roundabout, take the 1st exit onto the A9294 (New Kingsway). At the roundabout take the 3rd exit onto Stormontfield Road. **DO NOT** turn into the race course. Follow the road for 0.3 miles and turn right. Then continue driving for 0.5 miles where you will have reached the showground.

From Aberdeen & Dundee: - Follow A90 to Perth. Exit at junction signposted for Perth (A85) before Friarton Bridge. Follow A85 (A93) Braemar/Scone Palace signs. Follow local directions from here.

Local Directions: - Follow A93 Perth - Braemar. You should pass scone palace main gates on your left hand side, **DO NOT** turn into the main palace gates. Continue following the road (A93) for approximately 1.8 miles. At the roundabout, take the first exit (left) onto Cross Tay Link Road. Follow this road for approximately 1 mile. At the roundabout, take the first exit (left) onto Stormontfield Road. Follow this road for approximately 0.3 miles and then turn right. Note that you **do not** turn into the race course. Then continue driving for 0.5 miles where you will have reached the showground.
