ELIGIBILITY FOR CLASSES

In the following definitions of classes 1st prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Royal Kennel Club licensed championship agility, premier agility, open agility or limited agility shows (i.e. special classes and invitational events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round completed within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Standard classes may be scheduled for Agility Shows, as Agility classes or Jumping classes. All standard classes must contain the Weaving Poles obstacle. Standard Agility classes must contain the following elements: "A Ramp", Dog Walk and See-Saw. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:-

A maximum of 4 standard classes may be scheduled for any dog on an individual day of competition **including a maximum of 2 graded classes**. Any number of special classes may be scheduled.

Class Structure. A Class may either be held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for **a maximum of three** consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

Progression. Progression from each Grade will be determined by the eligibility for the class as referenced in H(1)(A)11. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade. To count for progression wins must be gained in standard classes at Royal Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows.

Only a first place with a clear round completed within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Points Progression. At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 4 by winning 100 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme (Regulation K3.d refers). A minimum of 50 points must be gained in agility (not jumping) classes in the relevant grade. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

Progression on points must be done prior to the closing date of entries. It is not possible to change a grade on points once the entries have closed.

STANDARD CLASSES

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Royal Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the two wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

Grade 1

Open to owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a minimum of two 1st places at Grade 1 at Royal Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, at least one of which must have been gained in an agility (not jumping) class. *N.B Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1 are not eligible for this class.*

Grade 2

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 1 and are not eligible for Grades 3, 4, 5, 6, or 7.

Grade 3

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of two 1st places at Grade 2 at Royal Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, one of which must have been gained in an agility (not jumping) class or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 and are not eligible for Grades 2, 4, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 4

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of three 1st places at Grade 3 at Royal Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping classes), or have elected to progress on points from Grade 3 and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 5

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four 1st places at Grade 4 at Royal Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 4, 6 or 7.

Grade 6

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four 1st places at Grade 5 at Royal Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, three of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 4, 5 or 7.

Grade 7

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of five 1st places at Grade 6 at Royal Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, three of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 4, 5 or 6.

Championship Class (Royal Kennel Club Championship Agility Certificate)

Open to dogs having qualified to compete in Grade 7 which have had five wins at Full Height in either Grade 6 or Grade 7, at least three of which must be gained in agility classes. To consist of 2 qualifying rounds of Standard Royal Kennel Club Classes, 1 Agility Class and 1 Jumping Class, and a final round of Agility, to be held at the same Show.

SPECIAL CLASSES

Societies may schedule classes other than those defined above as “Special classes”. The eligibility for “Special” classes must be defined by the Society and included in the schedule. The word “Special” must be included in the title of the class. Where special classes are classified for older and/or inexperienced dogs, the height of the hurdles, the A-ramp, and the dog walk, and the length of the long jump, may be reduced below the dimensions specified in these regulations, in which case such dimensions must be included in the class definition in the show schedule.

Marking for special classes may deviate from marking for standard classes but must be specified in the schedule. Wins, places and clear rounds in special classes will not count towards agility warrant points or grade progression at Royal Kennel Club shows.

Measuring of Dogs - Competitors are reminded that all dogs must have been officially measured before competing at a Royal Kennel Club licensed agility show. Record books or proof of measurement must be available on request.

Special Veteran Jumping - for dogs aged 9 years old and over at date of show. This class will contain jumps and tunnels only i.e. no weaves, tyre or long jump.

Large & Intermediate dogs will jump Medium, Medium dogs will jump Small and Small Dogs will jump Micro height (400mm, 300mm and 200mm respectively). Dogs entered in this class **may not be entered in any standard classes** at this show. Results will be separate, prizes awarded for each dog height category for Veteran dogs.

Special Anysize Jumping - for dogs aged 18 months and over at the date of show. This class will contain jumps and tunnels only i.e. no weaves, tyre or long jump.

Large & Intermediate dogs will jump Medium, Medium dogs will jump Small and Small Dogs will jump Micro height (400mm, 300mm and 200mm respectively). Dogs entered in this class **may not be entered in any standard classes** at this show. They may enter Veteran if eligible. Results will be separate, prizes awarded for each dog height category for Anysize dogs.

Special Helter Skelter – for dogs aged 18 months and over at the date of show. A flowing jumping class that will contain jumps and tunnels only i.e. no weaves, tyre or long jump.

Jump heights will be Large, Intermediate, Medium and Small (600mm, 500mm, 400mm, 300mm respectively). Dogs will run at their measured height. All dogs will run the same course and after the class has closed results will be split into combined 1-3 and combined 4-7 with separate results for each height.

SADOTY Qualifier - Scottish Agility Dog of the Year 2027

1. The Scottish Agility Dog of the Year Competition is an annual event organised by The Scottish Kennel Club.

The final will be held at the SKC August Show each year with the winners in each height category being awarded the title Scottish Agility Dog of the Year (height category).

2. Qualification for the final will be decided by an accumulation of points at heats. To qualify for points the dog must have been clear in the class; that is having incurred no course or time faults. Points are allocated in each height category as follows: 1st 8 points 2nd 4 points 3rd 2 points 4th 1 point.

3. To be eligible to compete the handler must reside in Scotland and the dog's owner be resident in Scotland whenever points are gained. If the dog/handler are not eligible for points (i.e. they are not both resident in Scotland) then the points will move down the places and be allocated to the next Handler / Dog team who are eligible for points. It is possible for the handler or dog to no longer be resident in Scotland at the time of the final, they will however still receive an invitation to compete.

4. After the final heat the 12 dogs with the most points in each height category will be invited to the finals by the Scottish Kennel Club. In the event of a draw then additional dogs may be invited. A handler may compete in the final with more than one dog.

5. The finals in 2027 will comprise of a single round of agility with competitors running in reverse order according to the number of points they accumulated to qualify. The finals for the SADOTY 2027 will be held as part of SKC's August Agility Show. To be awarded the title of Scottish Agility Dog of the Year the dog must be clear within the course time in the finals.

6. Heats will be held throughout Scotland at Open, Premier or Championship Agility Shows held by RKC registered or listed clubs. To host a heat the club applying must have its main operating address based in Scotland. For SADOTY 2027, heats must be held between July 2026 and July 2027. To be confirmed

7. Heats will be held as a standard scheduled agility class, open to all dogs eligible to compete in that class. The class will be held as a combined or graded 6/7 class. This cannot be a capped class.

8. Handlers and dogs will qualify as a team. A dog may, therefore, collect points with more than one handler and these will NOT be amalgamated. A dog may only qualify for the final with one handler, and the handler with the highest number of points will be invited.

9. Judges will be selected in each heat by the organising club who must be satisfied as to the judge's competency to judge this standard of class.

The Showtime Novice Cup Final 2026

By kind permission of Dundee AATC and the Scottish Kennel Club this will be held under a special license on the evening of Saturday 15th August 2026 in Ring TBD after all competition rings have finished.

This years' judge is Emma Pirrie

Rules & Regulations

1. Dogs entered at Royal Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Royal Kennel Club in accordance with Royal Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B or else registration or transfer of registration must have been applied for. The Registration number/Authority to Compete number will be required for each entry.
2. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Royal Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the Show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Royal Kennel Club Registration or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
3. FEES.
 - Single class entry £5.00, Championship £20.00 (DAATC Free of Charge)
 - There is no charge for NFC entries
 - Facilities Charge £1.50 per day per account holder (Toilets, Waste Disposal and Day Parking) (DAATC Members Free of Charge)
 - Camping £22 for the weekend + 2 days facilities Charge (DAATC Members Free of Charge)
4. PRIZE MONEY. There will be no prize money at this show.
5. Online entries can be made via www.Showtime-online.co.uk
6. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
7. Only dogs of 18 calendar months of age and over on the day of the competition are eligible for competition at Royal Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows.
8. A dog must not compete in the same class more than once, including special classes.
9. Not for competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged 12 weeks and over. Dogs must be Royal Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
10. A bitch which is in season is allowed to attend a show providing it is kept away from the competition areas. Except those dogs that are attending the show to compete in quarter-finals, semi-finals and finals of Royal Kennel Club Prestige Events, other than events held under YKC rules, who are allowed to compete in these classes only. Qualified handlers are asked to remove their dog from the competition area as soon as they have competed in the Prestige Event.
11. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the competition is forbidden.
12. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
13. Dogs must not wear any type of slip or half-slip collar or lead when under test. A single flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar, i.e. not attached by a ring.
14. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
15. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
16. SPONSORSHIP – **Just Simply Dogs, K9 Clippers, Mike Shaw Motors, Redanmuir Border Collies, Hawk CX, Wallace Vets, Pow's Paws Pet Services, Ovenstone Framing.**
17. Detailed rules for qualifiers are found earlier in the schedule.
18. Royal Kennel Club Standard marking Regulations apply for all standard classes.
19. Classes 37 & 80, Veteran Jumping. Height of the jump obstacles: Large and Intermediate dogs 400mm; Medium dogs 300mm; Small dogs 200mm. Classes 38 & 81 Anysize Jumping. Height of the jump obstacles: Large and Intermediate dogs 400mm; Medium dogs 300mm; Small dogs 200mm
20. Height limits for dogs:
 - a. **Large** – For dogs measuring over 500 mm at the withers
 - b. **Intermediate** – For dogs measuring over 430mm and 500mm or under at the withers
 - c. **Medium** - for dogs measuring over 350mm) and measuring 430mm (or under at the withers
 - d. **Small** - for dogs measuring 350mm or under at the withers
21. Judges at an Agility Show may not judge a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the show at which they are judging. Dogs will be disqualified if proved to have been handled in the class by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.
22. Removal of Dogs from Competition:

Following discussion with the show management and/or a veterinary surgeon, a dog shall be prevented from competing and/or removed from the Show if it is:

 - a. A bitch which is in season (apart from dogs attending the show to compete in quarter finals, semi-finals and finals of Royal Kennel Club Prestige Events, other than Events held under YKC rules).
 - b. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
 - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d. Of such temperament or is so much out of control as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.

The circumstances of such a removal shall be recorded in the competition/show Incident Book and submitted to the Royal Kennel Club.
23. Removal of competitors:

No equipment shall be moved without permission of the judge. Any concerns regarding the course shall be discussed with the judge/show management. Any unauthorised movement of equipment may result in removal of the competitor from the show. All such removals should be reported to The Royal Kennel Club in the Incident Book.

24. Dog Agility is a competitive and physically strenuous activity. It is the responsibility of the owner/handler to ensure their dog is 'fit for function' and that they themselves are fit to take part. By signing the entry form you confirm that to the best of your knowledge your dog is fit and able to take part in Agility classes on the day of the show.
25. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to & including 18 days before the start of the competition i.e. **28 July 2026** shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary **at least 14 days before the date of the show (1 August 2026)**. The dog will then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor will be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
26. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Royal Kennel Club.
27. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the club/society will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses. If the show processor has the provisions to do so, competitors will be refunded in the manner in which they entered the show, but in any event the society will refund fees within 3 months of the show date to all those who had entered and requested a refund within 1 month of the show date.
28. Except for mobility aids, nothing shall be carried in the hand while the dog is under test and food shall not be given to the dog whilst in the ring. Competitors are prohibited from wearing bags or leads whilst under test.
29. No dogs' crates or boxes should be left near or between rings. Societies may, if they wish, designate areas where dogs' crates and boxes may be left in the vicinity of the rings.
30. No smoking or vaping is allowed within the ring area.
31. The handler must set their dog up to start within the ring. Dog and handler must enter the ring together and under no circumstances may a dog be left outside the ring off lead and recalled or sent to the handler in the ring.
32. Should the judge deem a re-run is required, any result and/or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted.
33. Separate entry forms must be completed by each owner and must be signed by the owner or his authorised agent in accordance with provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees.
34. Free Passes - Not Applicable.
35. Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease – No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Royal Kennel Club Rule A11.
36. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Competitors must run as close to their running order as possible. Failure to do so may be reported to the Royal Kennel Club. In championship classes competitors must run in exact running order specified in the regulations.
37. Animals In Event - No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the Board. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
38. A pay on the day class will be held if time permits.
39. A practice ring may be available to dogs entered for competition at the show, if space allows. This ring must be supervised by a responsible adult with agility knowledge.
40. Welfare of Dogs. An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Royal Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Royal Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electric shock collars or prong collars is not permitted at any Agility show licensed by The Royal Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue and the precincts of the show.
41. Dogs Off Lead No more than two dogs off lead, per person, in the exercise area.

From the North – Head south out of Cupar on the A914 (South Road) and just before the end of the 30mph limit turn left onto the A916 (signposted Craigrothie, Leven). Travel through Craigrothie and after a further 2.4 miles turn left on to the unnamed road signposted New Gilston, Lundin Links. After a further 1.2 miles turn left at the junction (signposted Balcormo). The entrance to the show ground is 0.4 mile on the left.

From the South and West – From junction 2A on the M90 head east on the A92 until you reach Redhouse roundabout north of Kirkcaldy. Take the third exit heading for Kirkcaldy (A921) and at the next roundabout turn left onto the A915 signposted Leven, St Andrews. Continue on A915 until roundabout following signs for Windygates/Kennoway Travel via A916 (Kennoway – Craigrothie) and leave to join the unclassified road SP New Gilston / Lundin Links, travel south approximately 1.2 miles further before turning Left towards Balcormo and the venue.

If heading East on the A91 - Turn right at Strathmiglo on to the A912. Follow this road through Falkland to the New Inn roundabout (5.8 miles). Take the third exit on to the A92 (signposted Edinburgh, Kirkcaldy) and follow this road to the second roundabout (2.9 miles) and take the first exit to Leven, Buckhaven (A911). After 4.2 miles take the second exit at the roundabout on to the A915 (signposted Leven, St Andrews). Thereafter follow the directions above through Leven to Lundin Links (4.4 miles).

In Lundin Links, when the road swings sharply to the right, take the Cupar Road on the left (signposted Cupar 9 miles) Follow this road for 2 miles then turn right at the junction (signposted Balcormo). The entrance to the show ground is 0.4 mile on the left.
